

THE NEXT CANADIAN ELECTION WILL BE HELD ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 2021

WHO CAN VOTE?

To vote in the Canadian federal election, you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen
- Be at least 18 years old on election day
- Prove your identity and address

HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE

If you are already registered, you might have received a voter information card in the mail. Your voter information card tells you where and how to vote.

If you do not have your voter information card, you can register to vote two ways:

- 1. Online: you can register online by Tuesday, September 14, 2021 by 6:00 pm
- 2. In person: On election day or at an advance polling stations. You will need to bring your identification (ID) and proof of your physical address. You cannot use ID that only lists a mailing address (PO Box, rural route, or general delivery) to register. <u>What types of ID can you use?</u>

VOTING METHODS

1. Applying for a Mail-In Ballot Online:

NOTE: Application Deadline: Tuesday, September 14, 2021 by 3 pm Pacific Time

This method requires an online application including downloading personal ID information. Registration requires computer knowledge and access to scanner/fax. Once the application is submitted and received, a mail-in ballot with prepaid envelope will be mailed out to be completed by the voter and mailed in according to the instructions. 2. Applying for a Mail-In Ballot in Person:

NOTE: Application Deadline: Tuesday, September 14, 2021 by 6 pm Pacific Time

You can pick up an application for a mail in package at the Elections Canada office, take home, complete the application form and drop off the application at the Elections Canada office with ID. You cannot apply for a spouse unless that person



is unable to able to access the Elections Canada office due to medical/physical limitations in which case you will need your spouse's ID.

3. Vote in Person with a Special Ballot:

NOTE: Deadline to Vote is Tuesday, September 14, 2021 by 6 pm Pacific Time

You can vote in person with a special ballot at any Elections Canada office when they are open. Bring your ID and you must know the correct spelling of the name of the candidate you wish to vote for (no lists provided).
